John Dribus is the Global Geosciences Advisor for Schlumberger Oil Field Services. He is a Reservoir Geologist with over 39 years experience and has worked all aspects of petroleum exploration, exploitation, and production geology. He worked five years as a uranium field geologist as part of the National Uranium Resource Evaluation project in the 1980's and then 20 years for Mobil Oil Corporation as a petroleum geologist, including 14 years working the deep water Gulf of Mexico and subsalt province. He has worked the past 14 years for Schlumberger as Northern Gulf of Mexico Operations Manager and then as Schlumberger Director of Geoscience Curriculum responsible for redesigning their internal geosciences training program. He is currently their Global Geologic Advisor working deep water basins in the Northern and Southern

Gulf of Mexico, Greenland, the Barents Sea, the Black Sea, the Red Sea, Ghana, Gabon, Angola, Colombia, and Brazil, with emphasis on sub-salt and pre-salt exploration.

His expertise is in exploration geoscience, petroleum systems analysis, global deep water turbidite analogs and regional geology, exploring in salt basins, and geological risk analysis. He is the former Chairman of the Advisory Board of the American Petroleum Institute (API) Delta Chapter, serves on the Imperial Barrel Award Committee of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG), and is a member of the AAPG (30 years), New Orleans Geological Society (NOGS), Houston Geological Society (HGS), the Society of Petroleum Engineers (SPE), and the European Association of Geoscientists & Engineers (EAGE). In the past two years, he has made technical presentations on deep water, plate tectonic, and salt-related subjects to AAPG, SPE, SPWLA, NOGS, AADE, SIPES, and EAGE. In 2013 he was recognized by the Society of Petroleum Engineers with the Eastern North America Region Reservoir Description and Dynamics Award, and in 2014 he has been invited as a speaker at the AAPG Playmakers Forum and Discovery Thinking Workshop.

"Application of Plate Tectonics in Exploration along the Margin of the Atlantic Ocean Basin"

The margins of the Atlantic Basin have recently emerged as an exploration oil corridor with two key reservoir types attracting most of the attention:

- The Cretaceous Brazil Tupi/Lula microbialite carbonate reservoirs and associated facies are being actively explored for across the rift system in conjugate basin along western Africa.
- The Cretaceous Ghana Jubilee basin margin turbidite play and its equivalents are being explored for in the deep waters of Ghana, Liberia, and across the basin floor transform system to French Guiana and now the equatorial basins of Brazil.

This talk will briefly review how global plate tectonic models have been successfully employed to extend exploration analogs across rift and along transform plays from one Atlantic coastal margin to the corresponding side.

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Chairman's Message



I am truly honored to be your API Delta Section Chairman again in 2014. I am very excited about all we have planned this year as we continue the progress we made in 2013. I will repeat some of my January 2013 message since I still feel the same way today.

So why did I become involved in API? I am proud of our industry and what we have accomplished. Our use of technology constantly amazes me. We deal with extremes of temperatures (over 400F), pressures (15,000 psi) and environments that few other industries have to address. We take large financial risks to find new reserves (\$100MM dry hole cost for a wildcat that has a 35% chance of success in deepwater), invest billions of dollars in platforms, pipelines, facilities, and refineries and are still able to provide a gallon of gas for less than a cup of coffee from Starbucks. In my experience, those I have met in our industry are keen to protect the environment and keep our work force safe. I have not met anyone in our industry that I felt would intentionally sacrifice these goals. It would like to enhance our industry's reputation in the community and I think our API organization does that by its work in the community.

The Delta Chapter takes great pride in providing numerous educational programs that promote our industry. In 2013, we awarded \$20,000 to college students. In 2013, we re-established our teacher of the year award and awarded \$7,400 to worthy teachers in our area. In 2014, we will be expanding that program to \$10,000. We offer mini-grants to exceptional high school teachers. The Chapter also offers awards to high school students and their teachers participating in the Greater New Orleans Science and Engineering Fair held at UNO. We sponsored the FIRST LEGO competition and the FIRST Bayou Regional Robotics Competition.


At the Louisiana Children's Museum (LCM), we sponsor special programs such as "Super Science Saturday" and "FETCH Oil and Energy Saturday". Members of the Chapter donate their time and talents to assist in these activities, bringing excitement and fun to the learning process for both children and their parents. This year we hope to expand our relationship with LCM and with other area children's museums. We feel that if we don't show our industry's image in a positive light to children, media will present a very negative opinion of our industry that is difficult to change.

We will continue our Golf Tournament and Father/Son Sporting Clay Tournament as fund raisers this year and we hope you participate. The American Petroleum Institute - Delta Section is pleased to again offer college scholarships for the 2014-2015 school year and we are calling on our members to help get the word out. The goal of the scholarship program is to assist students reach their full potential through education. Scholarships are given for a wide variety of experiences, career goals and higher education plans. However, API will give preferences to those pursuing a career in Petroleum or Chemical Engineering, Geology and the sciences.

The API/Delta Board of Directors appreciate the strong support from our members throughout the year. It is that support that directly funds our scholarships. Through events such as the Annual Clay Shoot and the golf tournament, we awarded over \$ 18,000 in scholarships in 2012.

Each scholarship will be paid directly to the College or University of the applicant's choice. The scholarships are non-renewable, but students can re-apply every school year. The eligibility requirements for the scholarships are:

- **Applicant must be recommended by a member in good standing of the API-Delta Chapter.**
- **Applicant can be a high school senior or one who is currently attending a four-year accredited college, working towards a Bachelors or Masters degree.**
- **Applicant must be a full-time student with a minimum of 12 semester hours.**
- **Applicant must have a minimum overall GPA of 2.5.**




